Today's Liturgy

The Greek verb to abide or remain (menw) is used constantly (53 times!) in John. It expresses a desire for loyalty and group cohesion, and gives an important clue to us about the radical nature of this community, about its feeling of being outside the mainstream, and about its preoccupation with keeping community members together. It is used both in reference to attachments to Jesus and to one another. This duplication is carefully thought out, and it is the key to the author's intention in this passage.

Because this is Jesus' final conversations with his friends, the rhetoric becomes more and more concerned with love and death among the disciples in the situation after Jesus' execution. Verses 12 and 17 bracket the central section with the idea of Jesus giving a commandment of love. Now the disciples are to remain with one another and love one another just as they once remained with and loved Jesus himself. As this story is being told several generations after the events that are being described, the clear purpose is to keep the community bonded to one another in loyalty, which is why most scripture scholars believe that passages like this one indicate that John's gospel was written in the midst of a community in danger of falling apart.

Liturgia de hoy

El verbo griego de permanecer o permanecer (menw) se usa constantemente (¡53 veces!) En Juan. Expresa un deseo de lealtad y cohesión grupal, y nos da una pista importante sobre la naturaleza radical de esta comunidad, sobre su sensación de estar fuera de la corriente principal y sobre su preocupación por mantener unidos a los miembros de la comunidad. Se usa tanto en referencia a los apegos a Jesús como a los demás. Esta duplicación está cuidadosamente pensada, y es la clave de la intención del autor en este pasaje.

Debido a que esta es la conversación final de Jesús con sus amigos, la retórica se preocupa cada vez más con el amor y la muerte entre los discípulos en la situación después de la ejecución de Jesús. Los versículos 12 y 17 corchetean la sección central con la idea de que Jesús dio un mandamiento de amor. Ahora los discípulos deben permanecer el uno con el otro y amarse unos a otros tal como una vez se quedaron y amaron a Jesús mismo. Como esta historia se cuenta varias generaciones después de los eventos que se describen, el claro propósito es mantener a la comunidad unida en lealtad, razón por la cual la mayoría de los estudiosos de las Escrituras creen que pasajes como este indican que el evangelio de Juan fue escrito en medio de una comunidad en peligro de desmoronarse.

A time of holy hilarity

It's spring. There is new life beginning everywhere—in the earth around us and, if we will, in our souls. Both kinds of life, however, must be cultivated.

There is something about breathing fresh morning spring air that clears the head and opens the heart. There is no stronger sense of what it means to really be alive, to be poised for excitement, to recognize that what we are about to put into the day will change the world.

It is an exercise in “yes,” this slip-slide from winter to spring, from dark to light. Yes to today; yes to tomorrow; yes to life again. We all come out of the tomb of winter new and bright with promise. It is “yes” to life time now, however old, however jaded we may be. It is the rediscovery of possibility again.

The celebration of Easter Sunday is followed by Paschal Time, 50 days of holy hilarity while the church points again and again at the empty tomb. There are empty tombs in all our lives still, places where death did not conquer us because faith entered in to fill the dark spots. We have each risen from the dead and Christ has risen in us. Yes, the Easter season is about more than the Resurrection of Jesus. It is just as much about the resurrection of everyone around Him because of His own. Mary Magdalene rose again, this time a disciple. The apostles rose again, this time with courage and purpose. The little people for whom Jesus' whole ministry had been spent rose again, this time with new conviction and certainty. Rising again is the central message of the Christian tradition.

The poet Emily Dickinson, wrote: “Love is the fellow of the resurrection, scooping up the dust and chanting, live.” It's such a powerful image of universal resurrection, this sight of Jesus turning dust into life again, proving that creation is unquenchable in each of us.
