Today's Liturgy

Fr. Damien Dougherty, O.F.M. The opening statement of Jesus' discourse provides the key affirmation of his preaching, a clue for the correct ex-egesis of the entire Gospel of Luke. What Jesus is saying, implicitly, is that that which you see in me and hear from me is nothing other than the realization of the ancient promises. (In fact, the Greek verb employed is in the per-fect tense to indicate a past event whose effects endure in the present and is repeated by Luke at pivotal points in his work: Luke 9,51; Acts 2,1; 19,21).

This assertion of Jesus authorizes us to return to the Isa-ian prophecy that immediately preceded with the legitimate claim of recognizing within it the core of the Gospel that Jesus has come to bring to the world. He came to an-nounce the joyful news whose objective was, negatively, healing and liberation and, positively, freedom and grace. The addressees of these happy tidings, as Isaiah declares explicitly and Jesus corroborates, are the poor, the con-trite of heart, the oppressed, who were Yahweh's prefer-ence and are now the group favored by Jesus.

The Nazareans reject Jesus but cannot do him any harm because the time for his death has not arrived and he now turns his back on his own city, definitively, as none of the evange-lists report a return visit to Nazareth. The verb in-dicating Jesus' departure seems to have a technical sig-nificance in Luke's Gospel to underscore the movement of Jesus towards Jerusalem to bring his mission to its ac-complish-ment.

Liturgia de hoy

Damien Dougherty, O.F.M. La declaración de apertura del discurso de Jesús proporciona la afirmación clave de su predicación, una pista para la exégesis correcta de todo el Evangelio de Lucas. Lo que Jesús está diciendo, implícitamente, es que lo que ves en mí y escuchas de mí no es otra cosa que la realización de las antiguas promesas. (De hecho, el verbo griego empleado está en el tiempo perfecto para indicar un evento pasado cuyos efectos perduran en el presente y es repetido por Lucas en los puntos clave de su trabajo: Lucas 9,51; Hechos 2,1; 19, 21).

Esta afirmación de Jesús nos autoriza a regresar a la profecía de Isaías que inmediatamente precedió a la afirmación legítima de reconocer dentro de ella el núcleo del Evangelio que Jesús ha venido a traer al mundo. Llegó a anunciar las alegres noticias cuyo objetivo era, negativamente, sanación y liberación y, positivamente, libertad y gracia. Los destinatarios de estas felices nuevas, como Isaías declara explícitamente y Jesús corrobora, son los pobres, los confiados de corazón, los oprimidos, quienes eran la preferencia de Yahvé y ahora son el grupo favorecido por Jesús.

Los nazarenos rechazan a Jesús, pero no pueden hacerle ningún daño porque el momento de su muerte no ha llegado y ahora le da la espalda a su propia ciudad, definitivamente, ya que ninguno de los evangelistas informa una visita de regreso a Nazaret. El verbo que indica la partida de Jesús parece tener un significado técnico en el Evangelio de Lucas para subrayar el movimiento de Jesús hacia Jerusalén para llevar a cabo su misión.
