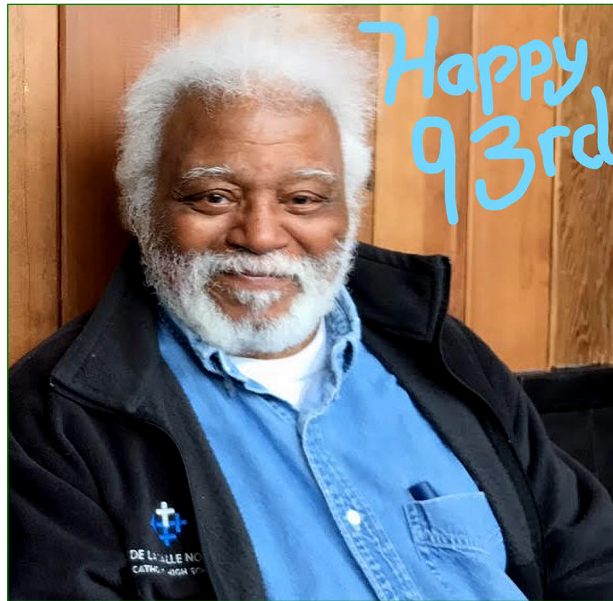

Today's Liturgy

Because the opening line refers us directly to v. 32 we almost feel tempted to skip the curses as those maledictions could not have been directed against Jesus' audience. However, from the point of view of the contents of the discourse, the introductory verse is actually being presented as linked to both the last blessing and the last curse.

The passage is structured in this way: first, the surmounting of the principle of retribution (vv. 27-31), then the invitation to charity based on the model of God (vv. 32-36), all is then concluded with an entreaty against judging (vv. 37- 38). It is useful to note that, just as the second part ends with Jesus' solemn affirmation (v. 36), so too the first part concludes with the so-called "golden rule" (v. 31).

The love of neighbor is imposed upon the disciple with the maximum degree of obligation. The law of retaliation (Matt. 5,38) is not only definitively surpassed, but it is substituted with the law of pardon requiring a self-abnegation even to the point of total gift of self for others. Not only friends but even enemies must be the object of Christian love: love, do good, bless, pray; enemies, those who hate you, curse you, abuse you. In v. 30 Luke expresses in a positive way the fundamental requirements that do not consist of a mere passivity when confronted with insults or wrongs, but of the assumption of an attitude of love that constitutes the most eloquent moral response that we can give.

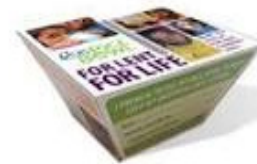

Debido a que la línea de apertura nos remite directamente al v. 32, casi nos sentimos tentados a omitir las maldiciones ya que esas maldiciones no podrían haber sido dirigidas contra la audiencia de Jesús. Sin embargo, desde el punto de vista de los contenidos del discurso, el verso introductorio se presenta en realidad como vinculado a la última bendición y la última maldición.

El pasaje está estructurado de esta manera: primero, la superación del principio de retribución (vv. 27-31), luego la invitación a la caridad basada en el modelo de Dios (vv. 32-36), todo se concluye con un la súplica contra el juicio (vv. 37-38). Es útil notar que, justo cuando la segunda parte termina con la solemne afirmación (v. 36), también la primera parte concluye con la llamada "regla de oro" (v. 31).

El amor al prójimo se impone al discípulo con el máximo grado de obligación. La ley de represalia (Mat. 5,38) no solo se supera definitivamente, sino que se sustituye por la ley del perdón que requiere una abnegación incluso hasta el punto de entrega total de sí mismo para los demás. No solo los amigos, sino incluso los enemigos deben ser el objeto del amor cristiano: amar, hacer el bien, bendecir, rezar; Los enemigos, los que te odian, te maldigan, abusan de ti. En el v. 30, Lucas expresa de manera positiva los requisitos fundamentales que no consisten en una mera pasividad cuando se los enfrenta con ingenio. Insultos o injusticias, pero al asumir una actitud de amor que constituye la respuesta moral más elocuente que podemos dar.

Music and the Liturgy

When Music Should Be Used: We tend to think of the hymns as important in the liturgy. Actually, the most important parts to be sung are the ordinary parts of the Mass. This would include the Eucharistic acclamations (Holy, Holy; Memorial Acclamation; Great Amen), and the Gospel Acclamation. Actually the Gospel Acclamation is to be omitted if it is not sung. The documents give us an option on the Gloria, but since it is a hymn of praise, singing is certainly to be preferred. The Lamb of God should be sung. The documents also recommend singing the Our Father, but this is one of the lesser followed suggestions, probably because participation is much greater when it is recited, and everyone can participate, including those visiting from other congregations, or even other denominations.

After these items are sung, we can add the processional chants and hymns. The most important of these is the processional chant at Communion, since it helps to emphasize the communal aspect of our action. Also important is the Gathering Song (another processional chant), since it helps to form us into a celebrating community. Less important is the song at the preparation of the gifts, since it is not specifically related to the action, but usually echoes the theme or focus of the readings and/or homily. The final song, or recessional, is not actually an official part of the liturgy, but has been added to send us out with enthusiasm and accompany the action. In most parishes, though, it seems that people do not recess during the recessional, but stay around to sing as long as the musicians lead.

196 families (637 individuals) received food from Emergency Services: 7,618 lbs. of food. Total assistance this month: \$7397. 65 volunteers worked a total of 330 hours in January.
