Palm Sunday 2019

Today's Liturgy

Gospel: Virginia Smith
Luke's version of the pivotal events comprising the climax of Jesus' earthly life resembles in some ways the others. Synoptics (he continues to make extensive use of Mark). However, his is also unique in that a number of typically Lucan themes continue to surface. Contrary to Matthew and Mark, Luke places the three predictions of the fate of the disciples within the Last Supper, and as might be expected since Luke softens or eliminates violence and harsh language wherever possible, his critique is more muted. In the same vein, Luke drops all reference to the apostles fleeing upon Jesus' arrest.

Jesus and his friends apparently walk to Gethsemane in silence; no dialogue is recorded. Upon their arrival, Jesus immediately kneels in prayer and encourage those accompanying him to do the same. This is in keeping with Luke's penchant for showing Jesus at prayer before every major occasion in his public life.

Only Luke chronicles Jesus' words, "Father, forgive them; they know not what they do." This gospel, often termed the Gospel of Forgiveness and Great Pardons, also notes Jesus' forgiveness of one of those crucified beside him, an episode that appears in no other passion narrative. Mark's reference to Jesus' mournful question to a God who seems to have abandoned him is replaced in Luke by the more self assured, "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit."

The episode ends with Jesus' body being laid in a tomb and treated in accordance with Jewish custom in much the same way his parents followed Jewish observance at his birth. This is a literary technique known as inclusion. Mentioning something first and last implies that everything in between is included as well. Here, Luke would be suggesting that first, last, and always, Jesus had been a committed Jew. © 2007, OCP. All rights reserved

Liturgia de hoy

Evangelio: Virginia Smith
La versión de Lucas de los eventos fundamentales que comprenden el clímax de la vida terrenal de Jesús se parece en cierto modo a los demás. Sinópticos (continúa haciendo un uso extensivo de Mark). Sin embargo, el suyo también es único en el sentido de que una serie de temas típicamente Lucan siguen surgiendo. Contrariamente a Mateo y Marcos, Lucas coloca las tres predicciones del destino de los discípulos dentro de la Última Cena, y como podría esperarse ya que Lucas suaviza o elimina la violencia y el lenguaje áspero siempre que sea posible, su crítica es más silenciosa. En la misma línea, Lucas deja de lado toda referencia a los apóstoles que huyen del arresto de Jesús.

Jesús y sus amigos aparentemente caminan hacia Getsemaní en silencio; No se registra ningún diálogo. A su llegada, Jesús inmediatamente se arrodilla en oración y anima a los que lo acompañan a hacer lo mismo. Esto está en consonancia con la inclinación de Lucas por mostrar a Jesús en oración antes de cada ocasión importante en su vida pública.

Solo Lucas narra las palabras de Jesús: "Padre, perdónalos; no saben lo que hacen ". Este evangelio, a menudo denominado Evangelio del Perdón y Grandes Perdones, también señala el perdón de Jesús de uno de los crucificados junto a él, un episodio que no aparece en ninguna otra narrativa de pasión. La referencia de Marcos a la triste pregunta de Jesús a un Dios que parece haberlo abandonado, es reemplazada en Lucas por la más segura de sí misma: "Padre, en tus manos encomiendo mi espíritu".

El episodio termina con el cuerpo de Jesús depositado en una tumba y tratado de acuerdo con la costumbre judía de la misma manera que sus padres siguieron la observancia judía en el momento de su nacimiento. Esta es una técnica literaria conocida como inclusión. Mencionar algo primero y último implica que todo lo que está en medio también está incluido. Aquí, Lucas estaría sugiriendo que primero, último y siempre, Jesús había sido un judío comprometido.

Easter Vigil

The Service of Light begins the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday evening. **All are invited to gather Saturday evening by about 8:20 P. M.** outside the front doors of the church where the new fire is lighted. Since this is a symbolic representation of the light of Christ overcoming the darkness, it is important that this liturgy begin after nightfall. The Paschal Candle, representing Christ, is lighted from the new fire and is processed into the church building leading the community into the space where the Exsultet is sung. This is a song of praise and gratitude to God the Father for the light of Christ represented by the Paschal Candle and for the reconciliation and redemption which Christ has won for us. The Exsultet concludes the first of the four parts of the Easter Vigil.
