Today's Liturgy

Gospel: Tom Conry

Stories of the appearances of Jesus after his crucifixion began to circulate through the churches very early on. These experiences of the risen Christ to individuals and groups were put into narrative form and told over and over.

Here the disciples are gathered together in the locked upper room, still filled with fear of the Judean elite who had cooperated with imperial Rome in arranging Jesus' execution. The background of this fear is not unfounded; not only are they under suspicion for their association with Jesus, but now the tomb is reported as being empty, and those who disturb graves are liable to capital punishment. In the midst of this tense situation, Jesus appears and breathes peace into their midst. In the early churches, baptism was the time when God bestowed the spirit, and this ritual breathing of Jesus fulfills the earlier promise of a baptism of the spirit for the disciples.

In the next appearance story, Thomas is reproached for not believing without seeing, but, as Jesus' earlier appearance has made clear, the rest of the disciples likewise needed proof, i.e. Jesus' manifestation in a locked room, before they would believe. The entire community, including Mary Magdalene, only believed when they saw. Jesus' words here indicate that from now, it is the testimony of the community that must be taken as authentic. Jesus has given the community authority to resolve disputes within the group (20:23) and, from now on, the demand for miracles will be taken as a sign of a lack of understanding and maturity.

Las historias de las apariciones de Jesús después de su crucifixión comenzaron a circular a través de las iglesias muy temprano. Estas experiencias de Cristo resucitado a individuos y grupos se pusieron en forma narrativa y se contaron una y otra vez.

Aquí, los discípulos se reúnen en el aposento alto cerrado, todavía llenos del temor de la élite de Judea que había cooperado con la Roma imperial para organizar la ejecución de Jesús. El trasfondo de este miedo no es infundado; no solo están bajo sospecha de su asociación con Jesús, sino que ahora se informa que la tumba está vacía y los que perturban las tumbas están sujetos a la pena capital. En medio de esta tensa situación, Jesús aparece y respira paz en medio de ellos. En las iglesias primitivas, el bautismo fue el momento en que Dios otorgó el espíritu, y esta respiración ritual de Jesús cumple la promesa anterior de un bautismo del espíritu para los discípulos.

En la siguiente historia de apariciones, a Thomas se le reprocha que no creyera sin ver, pero, como lo demostró la aparición anterior de Jesús, el resto de los discípulos también necesitaban pruebas, es decir, la manifestación de Jesús en una habitación cerrada, antes de que pudieran creer. Toda la comunidad, incluida María Magdalena, solo creyó cuando vieron. Las palabras de Jesús aquí indican que a partir de ahora, es el testimonio de la comunidad lo que debe tomarse como auténtico. Jesús le ha dado a la comunidad autoridad para resolver disputas dentro del grupo (20:23) y, a partir de ahora, la demanda de milagros se tomará como un signo de falta de comprensión y madurez. © 2003, OCP. Even the instructions in our liturgical books say that if the Alleluia cannot be sung, it should be omitted. So whether the liturgy is celebrated in a cathedral or a catacomb, "Alleluia" is our song.

THE 50 DAYS OF EASTER: The 50 days from Easter Sunday to Pentecost are celebrated in joyful exultation as are feast days, or better as one "Great Sunday."

Meals for Walnut Park Emergency Shelter

A girl scout troop, the AAC-CO, and a parishioner's girlfriend group also used our kitchen to prepare meals for Walnut Park residents.
