Today's Liturgy

Although this solemnity celebrates the ascension of Jesus to the Father ("and is seated at the right hand of the Father"), in reality it is a call to mission for all the faithful. The texts announce that Christ does not leave his disciples orphans; he promises them the Spirit of truth that will always accompany them. The Gospel focuses on this promise, made to the eleven when the risen Christ appeared in their midst. The mission is clear: announce, baptize, and proclaim the salvation of the Lord. We, too, are called to announce the victory of Christ over evil, to baptize those who believe in him, and to proclaim that a life in Christ is the beginning of our salvation in the present and for the future. It is important to begin to find those in our neighborhoods who seek God out but are not satisfied where they have found him. Now is the time to invite the community to discover those who seek God and invite them to take part in the process of initiation. This mission should be undertaken by all members of the community. Once identified, the new candidates should be invited to begin having those important conversations that so often help people accept the catechumenate, the path to initiation into faith and the Church.

Liturgia de hoy

Aunque esta solemnidad celebra la ascensión de Jesús al Padre ("y está sentada a la diestra del Padre"), en realidad es un llamado a la misión para todos los fieles. Los textos anuncian que Cristo no deja huérfanos a sus discípulos; Les promete el Espíritu de verdad que siempre los acompañará. El Evangelio se enfoca en esta promesa, hecha a los once cuando el Cristo resucitado apareció en medio de ellos. La misión es clara: anunciar, bautizar y proclamar la salvación del Señor. También estamos llamados a anunciar la victoria de Cristo sobre el mal, a bautizar a quienes creen en él y a proclamar que una vida en Cristo es el comienzo de nuestra salvación en el presente y en el futuro. Es importante comenzar a encontrar a aquellos en nuestros vecindarios que buscan a Dios pero no están satisfechos donde lo han encontrado. Ahora es el momento de invitar a la comunidad a descubrir a quienes buscan a Dios e invitarlos a participar en el proceso de iniciación. Esta misión debe ser emprendida por todos los miembros de la comunidad. Una vez identificados, se debe invitar a los nuevos candidatos a comenzar esas conversaciones importantes que a menudo ayudan a las personas a aceptar el catecumenado, el camino a la iniciación en la fe y la Iglesia.

Red

Red is the color used for the Holy Spirit as on Pentecost, and also for those who have shed their blood for the faith, such as the martyrs. This explains why, during the festive (white) season of Christmas Time, the color red shows up almost immediately. It is used on December 26th, the feast of St. Stephen, the first martyr, and December 28th, the feast of the Holy Innocents, those who were killed by King Herod as he tried to prevent what he saw as a possible challenge to his rule. These feasts occur during the week, not on Sunday. Watch for red to show up during the liturgical year as we remember those courageous members of our family of faith.

POSTURE DURING THE LITURGY:

At St. Andrew Church our posture during the Eucharistic Prayer is standing rather than kneeling. This is in order to join more closely with the action of the presiding minister at the Table of the Eucharist. After the words of institution ("He took bread and said 'This is my body which will be given up for you' ... [A]gain he took the cup and said 'This is my blood which will be shed for you' ..." we are invited to join with the presiding minister as he genuflects we are called to make a profound bow in an act of homage. In doing this we engage our whole body in our prayer of worship.
